IUP Artist in Residence Apollo Mosaic August-November 2017

The Apollo-Ridge Education Foundation is creating a public art display for the town of Apollo in conjunction with IUP's ArtsPath Artist In Residence program. A professional artist is working with grade 7/8 students in periods 6/7 art to create a high-quality, lasting mural that pays homage to our history-rich community.

The two-phase project began August 31, 2017, and ends in the Spring of 2018.

Phase I consists of creating 7 five foot oval mosaics that depict the past, present, & future of our town. Phase II's mural will tie the mosaics together.

The list of historical people and places includes the WCTU Building, Nellie Bly, the Maple Tree, the bridge built after the 1936 flood, the fur trader, Edward Warren, and the Apollo Space Program.

One mosaic honors the lives of those who gave all for their country with a special mosaic honoring Leonard Miller. Another depicts our natural resources.

The students have been introduced to the history of mosaics, highlights of the history of Apollo, how to nip tile, the process of creating the layout for a mosaic, and how to adhere the tile to the concrete board. They've also had the opportunity work with a professional who shares her passion for art with them.
