

The trustees know that partnering with business and community leaders is vital to our ability to provide these types of learning opportunities for our students.

2016-2017 Strategic Highlights

BUILDING LIAISONS: To increase communication between staff and the Foundation, Janie Fryer, Chad Danka, Kristen Barta, and Bethany Greenlee volunteered to be liaisons for the respective buildings. They are responsible for scoring the Innovative Projects grant applications and encouraging staff to get involved.

REACHING OUT TO INDIANA COUNTY: The Foundation launched an aggressive advertising campaign for the 2016 Gala utilizing radio and print to increase visibility and gain new partners in Indiana County.

MENTORING AND MARKETING: The Education Foundation presented at a Powerlink Think Tank at Penn State's Small Business Development Center. Much positive feedback was received and is being acted upon. The Foundation hired Planful, an Indianabased marketing agency, to assist with rebranding.

NEW EITC PARTNER: In addition to annual donations from First Commonwealth Bank, Nextier Brank, and the Nutrition Group through the EITC program, the Education Foundation received a generous contribution from Waste Management, bringing the total to \$16,250 received through this tax credit program.

NEW MEMBERS: Membership increased by three new annual and fourteen new sustaining members for 2016-2017. Membership dues support the Innovative Projects Grant program.

NEW TRUSTEES: The Education Foundation welcomed Becky Magness, Jamie Laws, and Dan Consuegra to the Board of Trustees. Their individual strengths have contributed greatly to the success of the Foundation's activities.
